

# Wallaby supporters frustrated

*A group of residents formed to help the plight of wallabies and other native animals are feeling very frustrated at the slow movement of action relating to their requests for information.*

The group recently met with developers of the site and an environmental assessment officer.

At the meeting they heard how an initial survey of the site, had shown there were opportunities to maximise integration of the existing wildlife into remaining areas as they are built upon.

The developers have agreed to seeking a more comprehensive survey of the area and were told that it should be possible for animals to live closely and in harmony with property owners.

It was explained that properties fronting wildlife corridors could be encouraged to not have fences so animals could graze on their lawns.

Development of plans for the site are at an extremely early stage and a number of studies including a full drainage management / waterway system analysis needs to be carried out before it can even be established which areas of bushland may be available.

The group have been concentrating on areas where animals are being dislodged from traditional grazing habitats by development, particularly focussing on the land between Trinity Beach and Trinity Park.

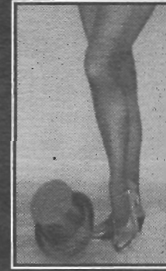

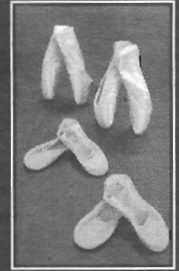
